- Class Teacher Concept -For every 10 students 1 student is selected as a CR, which is the foundation for the Quality Circle. The QC deliberates upon the academic and the administrative aspects at their level. This is further taken up at the Class level in the month end IQAC review.
- The necessary soft skills, life skills, communication skills etc, which enhances the employability of students are provided in the institution under the leadership of IQAC through HRD – I, II & III units. The first year students are given an Orientation to the college along with a Personality Development Programme prior to the commencement of classes through the HRD-I unit. The HRD – II & III units equip the students with language enhancement & analytical skill abilities. A tie up with Infosys ensures proper execution. Teachers are trained here.
- The IQAC takes initiative in organizing the FEEL Employable Programme which is regularly conducted in association with Aim Insights (CLHRD), Mangalore.
- Counselling services are provided to the students with the help of psychology department.
- Career guidance cell and Placement cell of the college facilitates the regular visits of the leading industries for recruitment.
- International Students Guidance Cell is incharge of injunction and mainstreaming of nearly 100 international students from 20 countries in our college.
- Students are actively involves in all the academic activities, they are encouraged to attend conference and seminars in other departments and in other colleges

5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

- Class Mentor method was adopted where each class students are monitored by a faculty.
- Remedial classes were conducted for interested and average student.
- Internal tests are conducted and the marks secured are reflected as Internal Assessment marks which are added along with the marks secured in the Semester end examination conducted by the University. Results are compiled Department-wise and are analyzed. In order to overcome barriers of learning, Remedial programmes are offered. The semester end results are an indication of learning outcome. Each course results in terms number of rank holders, distinction holders, first class and second class is noted and reason for poor performance if any is looked into. Special/remedial classes are taken for those students who had performed poorly. The teachers are always available to give additional inputs after class hours if required by individual students.
- Wide publicity is given for excellence achieved through news paper advertisements and reports. *Excellence award* instituted by the college are given during the felicitation function.
- Tutorial class were conducted in each subject where students will get practical exposure in learning Eg. By student's seminar, experts special lecture, case study method, group discussion, interaction with faculty and experts in a particular area. Based upon the participation and involvement of the students, evaluation will be done in the class and individual feedback will be given for the further improvement.
- Student's appraisal of the teachers is collected through a printed format. The Feedback is analyzed by the Research cell using Garrett Ranking method and communicated to the head of the institution. Principal discusses the same with the Management, Heads of the Department and the individual faculty members for further improvement. Average and poor results are seriously viewed. Appropriate steps are suggested ; subject teachers and concerned departments are made accountable for the results, correction and improvement.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The KSOU programmes of M.Sc (Bio Technology & Micro Biology) are entirely managed by Department of Studies in Life Sciences. The entire process starting from admissions, preparing lessons, conducting examinations, announcing results, revising syllabi is done by the Head of the Department of Life Sciences.
- The faculties are required to prepare a broad lesson plan details approximately detailing the techniques they would be adopting, time required to effectively convey the course ware. The technique to convey the communication, gauging the impact of communication by conducting frequent tests, surprise quiz, enactment of role plays, analysis of case studies etc.
- Periodic staff meetings are conducted by the concerned departments for the collection of updated information of the deployed lesson plans, academic calendar and the work progress of the faculty members. The same is verified with the control mechanism of the number of hours and the progress of covering the course ware. If deviations are made out, they are rectified immediately.
- The systems of “Quality Circle” adapted by the industries are employed here. Any issue concerning the quality of dissemination of the course ware are discussed by the faculty and the students, in order to arrive at a fruitful conclusion.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- New ideas and innovative ways of teaching is discussed in the beginning of each semester and is encouraged to be implemented if found feasible.
- The institution has taken initiatives for the effective delivery of curriculum by providing required infrastructure, well equipped laboratory, library and funds to organize seminars, workshops, conferences etc.
- Extensive use of ICT, subject experts from other institutions are brought in for seminars and interactions with the students to enable effective delivery in transactions. Field visits, study tours, internships, field work and project work directly connect with the industrial experiences of the students.
- Power point presentation, case studies, Group Discussion, role plays and visit to factories are regular features adopted to improve quality of teaching and learning.
- Individual training ,Group Training Method,Interactive training,clique training methods are adopted in teaching.
- **Academic Calendar:** The Institution brings out a well-planned calendar comprising the details of curricular and co-curricular activities for an entire academic year in advance. Each student and staff member is provided with a copy.
- **Teaching plan** The institution has a well planned time table for teaching as well as organizing subject-wise special lectures, seminars and conducting interaction and discussion sessions for students.
- **Evaluation Blue Print**
Respective Boards of Studies constituted by the University of Mysore lists out a panel of examiners who are appointed to the Board of Examiners by the University. The valuation guidelines are prepared by this body. The other aspects such as marks weightage for each of the units, sub-units, skill development, internal assessment are conveyed to the college along with curriculum details. In addition, the institution has an internal mechanism of planning the assignments, internal tests, Seminars, Educational tour, Project report, Field work report etc. Records of the same are maintained and internal marks are notified on the display boards. The same are reflected in the Internal Assessment marks.
- Compulsory case studies, assignments and seminars were conducted facilitating interactive learning process and combined learning process matching to the needs of adoptability of different concepts dealt at class room levels (individual learning to be converted to adoptability learning)

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The University of Mysore has not introduced any major evaluation reforms for the UG programmes. It follows 80+ 20 marks pattern, where 20 marks is Internal Assessment component. The institution has a role to play in awarding the Internal Assessment marks based on the broad guidelines given by the respective boards of studies of the University of Mysore. The pattern for awarding IA marks by the institution is as follows:

- Two Internal Assessment tests have been made compulsory for all students. 80% of the marks scored by the student will be taken from this component. The remaining 20% of the internal assessment marks are awarded by the departments based on assignments, skill development records, viva-voce, seminars/presentations.
- After obtaining the signatures of the students, the marks are uploaded to the University website.

At the PG Level

- In CBCS method continuous Evaluation system is followed. Continuous assessment will be conducted by the course teacher for C1 (15 marks) and C2 (15 marks). C3 is the Final examination conducted by the University at the end of the each semester.
- Continuous assessment criteria shall be decided by the course teacher at the beginning of the semester and shall be informed to the students in advance. Continuous Assessment Criteria include the following: Case study design, analysis and presentation, Assignment writing, seminar presentation, group discussion, review of research articles and its presentations, problem solving and test.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The institution recognizes the importance of research component in Higher Education sector and hence has established a well-equipped Research Cell.

- The Life Sciences Department have been recognized as Research Centres by the University of Mysore.
- Research Cell is taking lot of initiatives in promoting research culture by organizing workshops and seminars and also bringing out the compendium of the proceedings.
- Student research is mandatory in some areas of learning. The faculty acts as supervisors for the same. The institution provides with ICT and as well as library infrastructure for these. The Research Cell has financed partly the research projects of the students. Some of the findings are published in International journals.
- Proposals are submitted to different funding organization for research work.
- Many linkages and collaboration have also been established.
- Encouraging teachers to present research papers at International and National Seminars, Conferences and Symposia
- Publication of research articles in International and National journals
- Guidance to all research related activities like preparing proposals, paper presentations, publications etc are given by the committee. Financial support is extended by the committee to take up minor/major research projects, organize research oriented workshops and seminars.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The library has abundant collection of text books relevant to the curriculum with the augmentation of new books from time to time. A number of national and international journals, magazines and periodicals are being subscribed for the benefit of both students and faculty.

- Braille books are introduced in the library
- Drupal open source software is introduced for digital library
- Bluetooth scanner is introduced for stock verification
- Library is automated through Easylib Software and library website is available on the college website. E resources could be downloaded through Infilbnet software.
- OPAC (online public access catalogue) Internet facility is provided in the library.
- Best library user award is given to students for best use of library.
- Library provides facilities for in-house viewing of CDs.
- Laminated maps are displayed.
- Reprographic service provided.
- Conducting book exhibitions on different occasions.
- The Library has extensive print and on-line resources available for the exclusive use of researchers.
- Researchers can access e-library through Infilbnet, J-Gate, Del-Net, EBSCO and RMIT for e-books and e-journals. Researchers also can recommend materials for their respective use which will add to the library collection. Programme specific journals are also subscribed to facilitate research activity. Additional book borrowing, photocopy and scanning facilities are extended to the researchers. The library facility is also available at the departmental level. The students, faculty members make use of this facility for their research activity.
- A satellite centre of the college is started 5kms. away from the main campus, basically to address to the issues of space, facilities, ambience etc. The infrastructure of the Post Graduate Centre is developing, as new courses are getting added. Facilities for learning are upgraded every year like adding new equipments for Life Science laboratory and computers and its related accessories.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The highlight of the college is aiming towards evolving a Governance model for the institution, keeping in view the precious human resource in the form of students, faculty and administrative staff.
- Student Parliament is constituted for ASIC (Academic, Student, Institutional and Co-curricular) Support. ASIC committees have been setup in which 42 specific committees take care of the co-curricular and extra curricular requirements.
- Faculties with skills and expertise in these areas are appointed as mentors/convenors for guiding these students.
- Creative writing and reporting skills of the students are utilised for in-house publications of the institutions such as Mandara, Vichara, MFGC Times, Capitol, Infolet and Chitta. These publications are being designed by our technical staff.
- The department of Psychology is involved in Student Counselling.
- The NSS/NCC students have been sent to participate in the Traffic control, as tourist guides during the 'Dasara' festival.
- Channelizing the students towards social responsibilities through cells like NSS, NCC, Rotaract Club and Volunteers of Mahajanans.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Teaching faculties are recruited through interviews and demonstration by the Mahajana Education Society, both at UG and PG centres, as per Government/UGC/University norms and service is continued after a year of probation. Management follows the UGC guidelines for the fixation of salary.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- Under Liaison and Industrial Visit committee students visit small, medium and large scale industries. Experts from different industries are invited to interact with the students and to share their experiences.
- Entrepreneurs from various industries, Researchers and Scientists from various disciplines and subject experts from University of Mysore are invited to interact on various issues for effective operationalization of the curriculum.
- Institution has MoUs with various institutions such as College for Leadership in Human Resource Development (CLHRD), Mangalore, Justice K S Hegde, Institute of Management, etc. Every year teachers, alumni and parents are deputed for training as facilitators, who in turn orient the students through the college HRD-II unit.
- MTA department has entered in to an M.O.U with Hotels, resorts, travel agencies for internship.
- In addition, Career Guidance and Placement Cell takes initiatives to invite experts from industry for interacting with students and share their experiences. Several departments also takes initiatives to organize industrial visits regularly.

Besides this, teachers are trained in Analytical and Language Enhancement skills by Infosys in their 'Global Enhancement Skills Programme'. The students in turn are being trained under the college HRD-III unit.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

- The Institution follows the rules and regulations framed by Government of Karnataka and the University of Mysore and. Roster system is followed in the admission process. For PG courses prescribed seat matrix is followed.
- Publicity for admission through electronic media. Through print media like newspapers, college annual magazine, newsletter, prospectus. Mouth to mouth publicity by stake holders especially the alumni.
- The college constitutes the Admission Committee which carries out the entire admission process based on the admission policy given by the Government of Karnataka and University of Mysore.
- The applications are scrutinized by the Admission Committee, which makes the list of eligible candidates based on merit and roster system. The seat matrix for SC/ST, OBC, Minorities, outside state and university, differently abled are filled in a transparent manner.
- After the selection of the candidates list will be announced and the transparency in admission process is ensured. The selected students list is also made available on the college website. RTI requests are also diligently attended to. Display of up-to-date admission related statistics is given to public access apart from dispatching the same to Collegiate Education.
- Online registration is done through EIMS Software.
- Overseas students are facilitated through Franchises.

 - Involvement in bringing out Alumni newsletter.
 - Involvement in the academic and administrative development of the institution
 - A few alumni are now serving the college as faculty.
 - Guest lecture on “American Depository Receipt and Global Depository Receipt by Dr. Ullas Rao on 6th November 2014 who is an alumni of the college.

- On the Occasion of World Forestry Day 44 cadets planted saplings in College premises.
- **Energy conservation:** Initiatives have been taken to use CFL bulbs, Solar lights and also awareness has been created among staff and students to switch off lights and fans when not required.
- **Use of renewable energy:** 16 Solar Lightings in the campus and Solar energy is utilized and around 40 systems run on solar energy at the PG wing (Tourism).
- **Water harvesting:**
 - The rain water harvesting is done in PG wing. The rain water of the building is collected into a sump with 15 lakh ltr capacity and is used for garden.
 - Sewage water of the entire campus is treated and used for watering the garden.
- **Check dam construction:** A check dam is constructed to harness 6lakh ltrs of water.
- **Efforts for Carbon neutrality:** Students are advised to use their personal vehicles on alternate days and pooling of vehicles amongst the staff is encouraged
- **Plantation:** Currently a plantation of 200 variegated species providing green cover is available. With the completion of the check dam 200 more Teak plants (Tectona grandis) are to be planted. Total kitchen waste is composted and reused.
- **Hazardous Waste management:** The institution does not generate any form of hazardous waste.
- **e-waste management**
 - Few systems were refurbished and donated to a Government Primary School, in a near by village under the PURA initiative.
 - Few systems were sold to the staff members at a nominal rate.
 - Certain spares salvaged from the wastes are preserved by the institution to use it for learning purposes and the rest is disposed.
- Water holes are made and Birds,squirrelles are served at various points with corn tied to the trees in the campus by student volunteers.

7. Innovations and Best Practices

7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.

- **Student Parliament** - The aim of the Student Parliament-a democratically set up students' body partially resembling the Parliamentary system of the Indian Republic is to bring together students and teachers on a common platform to promote the idea of participation of every student and teacher in governance through ASIC engagements. It operates on the principle of '**one more opportunity for a student and one additional responsibility to the teacher**', providing the students and teachers alike, an opportunity to develop and hone their leadership skills. This leadership workshop as it is called thrives to achieve excellence through student-teacher participation at every level of college administration.
- **ASIC Committees - ASIC Committees** *i.e.* Administration Support, Student Support, Institution Support and Co-Curricular Support committees which are directly connected with college governance.It is mandatory for every student and teacher to involve in any of these committees.
- **Weekly Assembly**- An event where talent is acknowledged and appreciated, a platform for college newsletter releases – **Achiever, Vichara, Infolet, Capitol,Kadamba,Muses,Spoorthi etc**, birthday greetings and charity announcements are also an interesting part of this event. Assembly commences with the rendering of the State Anthem and concludes with the National Anthem. This platform ensures the direct dissemination of information of the events past and future week, information relating to key issues such as announcement of examination scheduling, payment of fees and call for volunteers of activities. This is held on every working Saturday between 10.30 a.m. and 11.00 a.m.
- **Education Report**- Is a detailed document printed annually reporting all the activities of the departments and the various committees and foras. It provides information on faculty wise admission details, result analysis, performance of the college and also the synoptic overview of all the Departments and ASIC committee activities conducted for the period.
- **Class Teacher Concept**- The college/department appoints class teachers/mentors from amongst the faculty members, who interact with the students in their classrooms on a day to day basis. 



The aim of the Student Parliament-a democratically set up students' body partially resembling the Parliamentary system of the Indian Republic is to bring together students and teachers on a common platform to promote the idea of participation of every student and teacher in governance through ASIC engagements. It operates on the principle of '**one more opportunity for student and one additional responsibility for the teacher**', providing the students and teachers alike, an opportunity to develop and hone their leadership skills. This leadership workshop as it is called, thrives to achieve excellence through student-teacher participation at every level of college administration.

3. The Context

Describe any particular contextual feature or challenging issues that have had to be addressed in designing and implementing the Practice in about 150 words.

Change is always resisted at its initial stages. The idea of Student Parliament was proposed and implemented, a general hesitancy was found to don the additional responsibility among the students and teachers. Breaking the barriers between teachers-students, to motivate them to come out of their safe zones and inspiring them to take up greater responsibility was a challenge.

The reluctance from the Student Population, to abide to such a practice at college level was certainly evident. Further, motivating students in such a scenario to adapt and internalize the positive elements of this practice was quite demanding.

The immediate objective of Student Parliament is to creatively engage the students to harness their potentials. The long run objective is to address the dearth of efficient leadership in our society. The concept has been appropriately nick-named as the perennial leadership workshop run by the college.

However, over the years the systematic approach and efforts of the experiment have succeeded in making people realize that such a practice like – Student Parliament will reap the long term benefits for the college and for students. Today, the practice has its own identity.

4. The Practice

Describe the Practice and its implementation in about 400 words. Include anything about this practice that may be unique in the Indian higher education. Please also identify constraints or limitations, if any.

The Student Parliament is a broad-based pyramid like structure. All the students of the college, constitute the electorate and the classes are the constituencies. The classes participate in the simulated general elections of the college by putting forth their representatives as the candidates. Ten students will have the privilege of sending one representative to the Parliament. Thus, the ten member group becomes the smallest electoral unit. Each unit decides its representative by way of unanimous decision or by way of elimination through election. Put together, all classes would send 181 representatives to the Parliament. The Principal nominates outstanding students who have excelled in academics, cultural activities and sports and some from those sections of the student population which might go unrepresented, like the international students, non-Karnataka students, differently abled, minorities etc to the Student Parliament.

In the second stage, the CRs are distributed among the subcommittees which function like the ministerial portfolios broadly categorized under four heads, popularly called the **ASIC Committees** *i.e.* Administration Support, Student Support, Institution Support and Co-Curricular Support committees which are directly connected with college governance. The number of elected class representatives in each of the committee depends on the nature and dimension of the work involved under it. The senior most amongst them is designated as Organizing Secretary who is equivalent to a student minister. No area or aspect of college is beyond ASIC and no single ASIC is beyond the access of the student.

In the third stage, a member of the teaching staff is identified as the Convenor for each of the Sub Committee. The Convenor's role is advisory in nature and though the Organizing Secretary is the Executive head, he/she functions seeking the guidance and directions from the teacher convenor. Generally each staff member is allotted one committee as per his/her choice/aptitude or capacity. ASIC manifests the collective task executed by both the teachers and students with timely support and guidance from the Principal.

The Student Parliament meets once in a month regularly to discuss upcoming programmes and to seek the opinions and suggestions from the CRs in connection with daily administration of the college. The practice has emerged as a highly valued participative exercise which provides a platform for the student leaders to express themselves and work for the good of the student community at large. This is a system which includes everyone in the college and it provides sufficient grounds to students to develop their leadership skills and take up responsibilities on their shoulders on their way to become, may be, the future leaders of the society.

Parliament in its advanced form is a cluster of motivated students who act with dedication, harmony and a sense of responsibility. These clusters are near autonomous structures whose propelling energy is generated from within not from outside. Choosing the Class Monitor, popularly called CM, for each class on a rotation for each month and forming a council to

select the Prime Monitor (PM) for each month gives a very dynamically charged up simulated democratic systems of Governance for daily administration of the college.

Matching the vigor of the youth, the teachers have guided them to form a nodal centre to train the aspiring institutions in these lines. They have moved out of the institutions to reach other institutions who have sought assistance in this direction.

5. Evidence of Success

There are 107 different committees which are functioning as on today.

A review of students' and teachers' engagement with ASIC was made to study the effect through structured questionnaires to elicit their response. CRs and the staff convenors took part in the study. Student Parliament and ASIC engagements is all about leadership, responsibility and student-teacher participation. 82% of the OSs are aware of their responsibility, and 74% of the elected CRs chose to become CRs to test their leadership quality. 52% of the CRs have a cordial relationship with their class teachers while 35% said it was a productive one. 74% of the CRs felt their tenure was useful. The high response indicates that through ASIC young students can be enthused on a leadership trail. Leadership is of great value. ASIC has well defined areas to groom good leaders. Some experience drawn here can be tried in real life situations too. It also indicates that CRs working with commitment in tandem with the class teacher and the Principal contribute to the overall betterment of the institution.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Please identify the problems encountered and resources (Financial, Human and other) required to implement the practice in about 150 words.

Student Parliament and ASIC experiments are a newly developed concept which is based on general faith and confidence in the students. It is an ambitious programme which is designed to be by them, for them and of them and that almost leads to self-governance by students when it reaches its final stage. The practical implementation of it certainly calls for an enormous amount of patience, willingness to take risk and perfect knowledge as to how the system functions. There are challenges enroute but they can be overcome/mitigated:

1. Non co-operation by students who do not want to share the privileges of leadership with others.
2. Resistance by staff members who are complacent and do not like additional responsibilities other than academics.
3. Half hearted approach by CRs and teachers towards less attractive portfolios.
4. Too much of involvement by students in the ASIC activities may affect their studies nullifying all the benefits that might accrue out of it.

The discussed model would become a success only with the wholehearted support from all the stake holders. Proper training to students and staff members on the principles of the system and its execution is very essential. A blue print to start with is ideal. It is better to carry out a pilot test with one or two classes to see how the concept can be practically extended to the college.

The college has nearly captured the concept to perfection. It has now become a practice well established. We have gone a step further to document the outcome of the experimentation through a well classified report. It can be seen there that the entire stock of ASIC comes out with vision statements, list of annual programmes and future goals.

It is a dynamic idea which can be harnessed to fetch useful results. It is a tool for empowerment of youth and a laboratory to generate future leaders.

Best Practice - 2

1. Title of the Practice

Education Report

2. Goal

Objective presentation of academic and co-curricular records of the college, annually.

3. The Context

Proper planning and meticulous execution are the hall marks of success for any organization. But, scientific management of an organization is always based on well documented information made available at the most appropriate time. Therefore, creating a data base is the fundamental requirement before taking up any meaningful activity. Because, that would give a direction for what is going to be done. The Education Report published by the college, in that sense, is an act of creating a dependable data base for and of the college, based on facts, figures and recording of real experiences.

The college is engaged in a multitude of activities, both academic and administrative in nature. The academic activities consists of those which pertains to students and teachers, eg. Results, attendance, internal assessments, library books, seminars, workshops, special lectures, soon and so forth. Admissions, salary disbursement, finance and establishment are the examples for administrative functioning. The whole lot of data pertaining to these areas as well as others are to be first ascertained and stored in order to make use of them at a later point of time.

The Education Report is so designed that it has a place to record every single organized activity under appropriate heads, for the college as a whole, and for departments, teachers, students and office. A pre-drawn format to enter factual details is made available. The college related macro picture is given in the general section at the very beginning of the report. It is followed by four major sections identified with the letters A, S, I & C. These letters are significant and they represent Administration support, Student support, Institutional support and Co-curricular support. Numerically there are more than 100 areas under which the documenting exercise is carried out. Together, these classified documents bring forth the collective single image of the college in a very orderly fashion.

4. The Practice

A sample format would contain eight specific heads. Every single department or ASIC Forum would fill them on a prescribed pattern. The chronological order would contain the following specific stages. It starts with name or title of the Department or ASIC Forum, followed by the Vision statement and the Mission statement. Activities carried out in one academic year is documented in the next stage. For a department it would also include results of the Semesters. Future plans are the next major title.

It is evident that all related and relevant information are entered in the report. It specifically serves the following objectives.

1. First hand information about the department / ASIC for one year.
2. Knowledge of end result or the final outcome of all the activities.
3. Scope for self evaluation.
4. Correction, adjustment and goal fixing for the next period.
5. Opportunity to compare against performance of others.

The Report also has a section earmarked for synoptic presentation of diary of events, starting from the first day to the last. This is the most valuable section which chronicles every worthy activity or event that marks a year in the life of the institution. This makes the report inclusive and complete. For, the major segment of the report is likely to miss on the minor events, which also has a significant role in the overall making of the institution. Thus, everything is included in the report.

The front cover page design is consistently followed over the years, without any change. The back cover page has the Vision and Mission statement of the institution. And, to make is close to real life and indicative of research quotient involved, it is produced in black and white. These are the starting features which makes the report stands out.

5. Evidence of Success

It is a unique experiment carried out by the college now being studied as a best practice. The massive exercise of producing report is an exhilarating experience. It involves a participative contribution by the Stake holders. Everything that is done or enacted finds its way to record books to finally make it a part of Education Report. It is an experiment carried out in the laboratory of the college. The result of which has very great educational value. It mirrors the institution as it is and holds out the true picture of the institution both for internal use and public consumption.

The significant points about the report are listed below.

1. Every activity is made measurable.
2. The outcomes and performances are quantified and recorded
3. It provides a road map for the future journey.
4. It heralds the inclusiveness practiced in the operation of the institution.
5. It fetches tangible results.
6. It evolves into a replicable model.

The University of Mysore has, today accepted this as one of the model practice to be implemented in 200 plus institutions. It has today formed, part of an important report submitted to University of Mysore. This is an indication to its potential and universal applicability.

The art of preserving the vital information regarding all those activities which makes the institutions, for the benefit of the posterity, is achieved by this practice. The reports for a period of time, taken together give valuable reflections to the making of the institution. The active involvement of students and teachers, first in productive engagements, and then, in recording them in the form of the report is a testimony for the commitment of them in actualizing the goals of sustained education. The impact is very much visible. They develop a rare skill development among them which may have lasting value for both of them.

At the community level, another kind of impact is seen. Infact, the Department of Collegiate Education had made arrangements to send a copy each of the Education Report to Government colleges coming under its jurisdiction.

The 2012 report was released by the then Chief Minister of the state. It bears testimony for its importance. It is conceivably the most innovative proposition that was ever tried by this institution, with a far reaching impact upon other institutions as well as the institution which are open minded, proactive and willing to probe multi-dimensional acumen of Education Report.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

It took some time before realizing the worth of the exercise. To convince the staff and students about the need for such a report also demanded a fair amount of human resource management. Apart from this, the cost involved was also quite high.

7. Notes (Optional)

For our understanding, it is for the first time that such an enduring exercise was even undertaken by a college. The college has received accolades for its novelty. Even reputed institutions have shown interest in the concept and tried to emulate it. It is a fulfilling moment to have planned and executed Education Report.

METHODOLOGY

The departments of the college prepare an annual Educational report, by summarizing the activities and achievements during the year. This is the basis of the SWOT analysis of the college. The departmental inputs provide with each of the component of the SWOT. Though the criteria may be varied, they are compiled on broad basis and subject to analysis. In addition to this a questionnaire was circulated to all the stake holders.

ANALYSIS, DATA COLLECTION AND INFERENCES

Collected information is compiled by the IQAC and broad terms of references are taken into consideration for the analysis.

The data is in the form of open ended opinions of the departments, filled in questionnaire from the stake holders was processed by using ranking software. The inferences have been drawn from both the departmental reports and as well as the compiled data of the survey. Resolved issues concerning the teaching-learning process are deleted and only the unresolved issues are reported.

- S16 Effective mechanisms are in place for enhancing the additional skills of the students to make them employable. These are by Knowledge and Skill interventions organised by external experts and as well as faculty.
- S17 A reasonably good placement profile
- S18 Good faculty members are an attraction for the students to seek admissions. Despite of several colleges opening in the near geographic vicinity, the college enjoys good student strength.
- S19 Reasonably good infrastructure, ambience and ICT facilities.
- S20 Research based knowledge
- S21 Research cell in some courses.
- S22 Research publications by faculty members,
- S23 Major and minor research projects funded by UGC.
- S24 Effective dynamic yet democratic style of leadership of the Principal and enlightened and service motivate Management is one of the great assets of this institution.

WEAKNESS

- W1 As the First Grade College is located in a predominantly urban area, there is very little scope for expansion of the infrastructure. This is due to the non availability of land in the vicinity.
- W2 Requirement of the state of the art ICT (MIS, making use of National Knowledge Network (NKK)), as the infrastructure is prone for technological obsolescence.
- W3 ICT facilities are not available at all classrooms.
- W4 Some of the programmes offered have not had many applicants. This is true of Science and Technology, Sociology and English which is also reflected in the admissions of the other institutions in the University Mysore area.
- W5 As the institution is affiliated to the University of Mysore, new programmes have not been incorporated by it.
- W6 Interdisciplinary programmes are not offered, mainly due to the lack of infrastructure.
- W7 Many programmes are in the Self-finance mode. Hence there is a shortfall in the budgetary allocation for the equipping of the laboratory and other infrastructure. Most of the budget is diverted towards the salary component of the faculty.
- W8 The absence of Boys Hostel facility is another weakness, which would, when provided, increase the intake of the out station and international students.

- W9 Library grant is another shortcoming. Hence, it leads to the departments to rely upon the central library totally. Departmental libraries would also help in the undertaking of research projects etc.
- W10 Funding for the research projects by faculty and students are limited. Greater financing of the same will improve in the numbers of the faculty and students research, in a number of research projects as principle investigators.
- W11 In house Journals are constrained due to lack of funding. This will enable Publications in the form of researched articles.
- W12 Very few students opt for civil services and other governmental sector for employment due to the lack of proper training, to approach these examinations.
- W13 Placement activity is on the decline. Training the students for employability at the corporate sector is falling short of expectations.
- W14 Sports infrastructure is lacking as there is an urgent need for an athletic track, swimming pool, etc., which would enhance the quality of the college players' performance.
- W15 Large numbers of the faculty serve on Temporary basis, which has resulted in frequent turnover of the faculty members. Salaries and allowances of faculty, both teaching and non-teaching are not on par with the prescribed scale, as many of the programmes are Self-Financed in nature. Government Grants for salaries is available for very few faculty members.

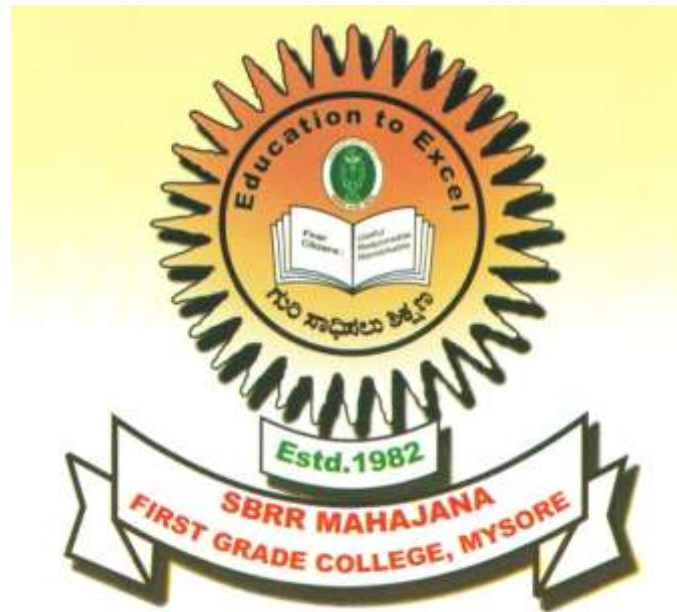

The AAA Committee was constituted to conduct a comprehensive review of the facilities and workings of the college after four years of its assessment and accreditation by NAAC in 2009(?) as a Mid-term quality assessment initiative with particular reference to notable changes and improvements in academic and administrative mechanisms, introduced during the post-accreditation period. The Academic and Administrative Audit was conducted to provide an objective insight to the college on the level of holistic quality improvements that have been implemented during the post accreditation period on all aspects of the seven criteria of assessment adopted by the NAAC. The committee has visited the institution and its departments and interacted with the stakeholders including the members of management from 13-10-2014 to 15-10-2014 and prepared this report for their consideration.

SBRR Mahajana First Grade College, Mysore- A Brief Overview

Mahajana Education Society (R)-The Founder

The Mahajana Education Society ® (MES) was established in the city of Mysore in the year 1937 with the objective of developing an academic institution for offering value-oriented and need-based courses to the general public. The efforts of the notable visionary philanthropists like Sri Ambale Subramanya Iyer, Sri Agaram Suryanarayana Pandit, Sri G. Ranganna, Sri Jois MN, Sri M.N.Ramachandra Jois and several others to leave a lasting legacy has become a reality in the form of several institutes of repute over a period of eighty years. The society is one of the premier educational societies in the State of Karnataka, in India.

The society has celebrated its Platinum Jubilee in 2012-13. It has established several milestones and hallmarks in this region in the field of higher education. Well-known personalities like late Sri. B. Rachaiah, former Governor of Kerala; late Sri Tulasidas Dasappa; Sri S.M. Krishna, former Governor of Maharashtra & former Chief Minister of Karnataka; late Sri Poornachandra Tejaswi-a noted writer and a host of very eminent personalities from the field of cinema, theatre arts & movies, Sports, Social Service and many other sectors, form a large number of illustrious alumni, from this institution.

The management is spearheaded by well-known educationist and entrepreneur, Sri R. Vasudeva Murthy as President, supported by a dedicated team of office bearers including Dr. P R Naga Srinivasa, as Hon. Secretary and Sri. N. Vijaya Kumar as the Treasurer of the society. The Governing body consists of very learned scholars, Ex-Vice Chancellors, writers, thinkers and people from various cross-sections of the society, who are assisted by a full time Administrative Officer.

Today, the Institutions of the Mahajana Educational Society, Mysore have branched out in several directions and have registered an unprecedented growth in terms of numbers, size and dimensions.

SBRR Mahajana First Grade College –The Background

The SBRR Mahajana First Grade College, Mysore, took its birth in the year 1982, exclusively as a women's college by offering B.A. & B.Com. Courses. The college was started with student strength of 66 and 18 staff members. It was brought under the ambit of grant-in-aid scheme of the Government in the year 1987. In the year 1988, it became a co-educational institution. Over a period of time, the college took a lot of initiatives to introduce new and new courses. The B.Sc. course was introduced in the year 1989; BBM course & Bio-technology, Biochemistry & Microbiology combination in B.Sc. were added in 1994 & 2004 respectively. The BCA course was introduced in 2008. The breakthrough in the academic development was made in the year 1999, by starting its Post-Graduation Centre, in the city of Mysore.

It is situated on a sprawling 20 acres campus on KRS Road, Mysore. As its maiden offer, this center commenced its three year Master Degree of Computer Applications (MCA) during the academic year 1999-2000. Further, the M.Com. course was introduced in the year 2002-03, and the M.B.A. course during the year 2004-05, which were followed by the M.Sc.(Biotech) course during 2004-05. During the year 2007-08, the M.Sc. Micro Biology course was started. The M.Sc Computer Science course was started during the year 2008-09 and the M.Sc (Bio-Chemistry) Chemistry & Economics courses have been added during the four years.

In addition to these, a Tourism Development institute was also set up to cater to the needs of budding tourism professionals. Both bachelors and Masters degree programmes are offered in this institute. This institute was initiated by Govt of Karnataka to promote tourism industry, in the heritage city of Mysore. All these have become major milestones in the path of Higher Education, laid by the education society. The college has celebrated its Silver Jubilee with the august presence of Dr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam, the former President of India. It is affiliated to the legendary University of Mysore.

Assessed and Accredited By NAAC

In the year 2001, the college was assessed and accredited by NAAC with Four Stars and reaccredited with B++ in the year 2007. College was recognized as the Lead College in the year 2003 by the Government of Karnataka. The IQAC of the college was formulated with a plan of action in the year 2008, and carried out a lot of quality initiatives. The college proposes to go for the third cycle of accreditation, shortly.

College with Potential for Excellence (CPE)

The college was recognised as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE), in 2010, by the University grants Commission. The College has also applied for obtaining the status of autonomy. General Observation

After the accreditation college made several changes on the basis of the recommendations given in the peer team reports. Most of the recommendations given in accreditation report have been fulfilled by the College.

CRITERION WISE ANALYSIS

Curricular Aspects:

Curricular Design & Development:

The institution has clearly stated its goals and objectives that were also communicated systematically to all its constituencies and stakeholders. The vision of the college is "imparting education with professional approach to make finer citizens: economically useful, socially responsible and culturally remarkable". The mission is "to develop necessary facilities to achieve accepted goals, to provide enriching inputs for better careers, to empower youth for contemporary social tasks and to support social endeavours and traditional values with sustained efforts".

All the academic programmes are in line with the institution's goals and objectives. The programmes are oriented to Social relevance and national development. The programmes are

taught with career orientation and for meeting the trends of globalization with quality dimensions, Value orientation and Heritage. The goals and objectives are laid down in the college education report provided to the students, teachers and stakeholders. The institution meticulously plans and develops action plan for the effective implementation of the curriculum.

The academic calendar is issued, well in advance, before the beginning of the academic year which helps the staff members to plan and decide steps to be initiated to achieve the goals.

The departments attempt to transact the curriculum through teaching-learning viz classrooms, laboratories, seminars, symposia, educational visits and several other co-curricular activities.

Academic Flexibility:

The programme options provide a lot of scope for promoting general competencies and skills among all students, in addition to Inter and Multidisciplinary studies. Employability is one of the considerations in the overall development of the curriculum. The institution has a wide range of programme offerings that provide adequate academic flexibility. Options are also available for students to take additional / supplementary / add-on courses along with their regular curricula.

Feedback on Curriculum

There is a structured feedback analysis followed by the institution as evaluation is made by almost all stakeholders. The students' opinion regarding teaching and evaluation is collected by the college through IQAC.

The parents also express their opinion during their periodic meetings. The alumni also give their feedback on evaluation mechanism and various developmental issues. The organizations which visit the institute for recruitment selections also give their feedback about the competence of the students and corrective measures.

Curriculum Update

The updation of syllabus is done on a regular basis, facilitating the incorporation of advanced topics, through Boards of Studies in the University, once in three years. There is visible faculty participation and initiative in the curriculum development and restructuring carried out at the university level.

Best Practices in Curricular Aspects (If any):

The College annually prepares a handbook (Academic planner as Calendar) containing programmes of courses, time-table, dates of various activities, internal evaluation, college rules, schedule of curricular activities, cultural activities, functions, extension services etc. This handbook is distributed to the students before the commencement of the academic session.

Teaching-Learning & Evaluation:

Admission Process and Student Profile

Admissions process is transparent. Counseling offered to students before selecting courses helps them in proper programme selection. Approved government and University norms are adopted for admission. The college ensures proper access and equity to all sections of the society.

Catering to the Diverse Needs:

Slow learners are identified and remedial coaching is given to improve Spoken English, Communication skills and quantitative methods. The College is following a Class-Adviser system for mentoring the students. Weak students in various subjects are helped by the faculty.

Teaching-Learning Process:

The teaching schedule and methodologies are planned and organized in advance. Educational Technology is effectively used by the faculty. For this purpose, the College is equipped with modern gadgets for teaching, learning and research.

The institution also encourages students with IT enabled teaching and ICT facilities to keep pace with the modern trend of development in curriculum and curricular transaction with quality and competence. The campus has Wi-fi network. In order to make teaching-learning more effective almost all the departments conduct workshops, seminars, group discussions, quiz, field visits, and study tours. Internet and audiovisual aids supplement the teaching-learning process in some departments. The routine class room teaching is supported by debates and lectures by experts. Class room interactions of faculty and students is highly visible and students attendance is continuously monitored. Many departments provide job oriented training to the students.

Students and faculty make optimum use of library and laboratory resources. Through student seminars, quiz programmes, field trips and project reports, students are given practical orientation.

Teacher Quality:

Twenty percent of the teaching faculty members have M.Phils and Ph.Ds. Seventy-five percent of the positions are under grant-in-aid scheme and the remaining are filled up by the management. Recruitment of faculty is done as per State Govt. and UGC norms. Many teachers have availed the faculty development programmes.

Evaluation Process and Reforms:

There is Internal assessment component in the evaluation system of courses. Continuous evaluation of students' progress is done by conducting regular centralised tests. Continuous evaluation and monitoring of students' progress are done with care. The college conducts centralised tests and university model tests.

Best Practices in Teaching-Learning and Evaluation (If any):

Student mentoring throughout his/her course of study is attempted by the teachers.

Research, Consultancy & Extension:

Promotion of Research:

The faculty who have doctoral degrees have shown periodical publication of research papers. The institution provides a start- up grant for research and development. Around Fifty percent of the faculty have published their research articles in reputed Journals.

The College has constituted a separate Research cell to coordinate all the research activities of various depart and their faculties and also to initiate new research schemes. The research activities of the College have increased with the recognition of 2 PG departments as Research Centres by the University of Mysore. A few teachers have done minor and major research projects and some are carrying out minor research projects, at present. Each department invariably has one or two on-going minor research projects. Research facilities and progression are very significant in the PG departments. The management is providing support for research and provides funds for travel for presenting papers and attending conferences and seminars. A few teachers have authored books and contributed in edited volumes. The teachers have published a good number of research articles/papers in international and in national journals. The college has made it mandatory to publish atleast one paper per faculty per year scheme.

Research and Publications Output:

The faculty members have published a large number of articles in national and international journals, presented papers in both national and international seminars and conferences. A few faculty members have authored books with ISBN numbers. Innovations in teaching and learning process are made by introducing seminars and projects at UG and PG level.

A few Departments regularly bring out their newsletters . Teachers have individually and jointly published some books. There is a need to strengthen the publications of faculty in terms of research papers, books and articles.

Consultancy:

Formal consultancy is not visible. Informal consultancy to the neighboring villages is extended, by a few departments.

Extension Activities:

The College organizes regular outreach programmes for the welfare and upliftment of the neighbourhood, through its sociology and social work departments. Such activities include medical camps, awareness programme for health and hygiene etc. A large number of teachers and students donated blood through blood donation programmes in the College. The environmental science department created awareness about clean campus programme, methods of protecting the environment and conservation of water. Community services through NSS, Medini, Counselling Centre, and Programme on health and AIDS awareness through Sanjeevini and Public Education Programmes were organized. For recreation and relaxation, programmes like music, dance and yoga were also conducted.

Collaborations:

Collaborations exist at the college level with industries and agencies for on-the job training and educational progress of students.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources:

Physical Facilities:

The First grade College campus houses three major blocks having -- class rooms , --- laboratories, seminar halls and conference rooms, in addition to the office, library and Edusat halls. Most of the departments have LCD projection facilities for ICT enabled teaching. There is a smart class-room in the Geography department.

All the classrooms of the PG centre are well equipped with computer, internet and other teaching aids. The College has kept pace with its academic growth by gradually augmenting its infrastructure facilities. The college makes optimum use of the infrastructural facilities to the optimum level.

There is also provision for research facilities in terms of laboratory equipment, research journals and research incentives.

Maintenance of Infrastructure:

The maintenance of the infrastructure is very good.

Library as a learning resource

The main library of the College housed for UG students has a substantial collection of books, magazines and journals, which is to be increased considering the number of students and programmes. The library may quickly go for providing OPAC facility with bar-code reading facilities for books for digital transactions. The library is kept open for 8 hours (9 AM to 5 PM) every day. It has spacious reference section. It has also internet browsing and reprographic facilities. There are broadband services with a speed of 8 MBPSs, with two servers. The functioning of the library is monitored by the Library Advisory Committee.

The library has a reading hall-cum reference section, in a separate floor. The Library Committee of the College functions to (a) promote reading habits among students, (b) attract more students to make use of various facilities of the library, (c) encourage students for further study and research in their subjects and (d) to encourage students to read great literary works.

All the departments have computer and internet connectivity. There are more number of Libraries to meet the requirement of students. Almost all PG departments maintain their own libraries with special collections for the use of students. INFLIBNET E-resources, on-line journal facilities and DELNET are available in the main library housed in both UG and PG centres.

ICT as Learning Resources:

The institution has a website. The milestones set for academic betterment was addressed by increasing the use of information and communication technology tools, like Audio-Visual facility, internet browsing centre, Edusat, Vsat and Research Cell, in addition to the avenues of regular teaching and learning.

Other Facilities:

The college has adequate number of classrooms and laboratories, administrative rooms, big space for library and reading, Gym, Sports and Indoor/outdoor Games and Girls rest room, departmental libraries with TVs, Seminar Hall, Vehicle parking space and two computer labs. University and Inter-collegiate sports and games are conducted in the playground. There is an open air auditorium.

Best Practices in development of Infrastructure and Learning Resources:

The best practices implemented by the institution are (a) Net worked campus and free network access to students and teachers, (b) transparent internal assessment system, (c) Invited lectures by experts, (d) language laboratory, and (e) new research division.

Student Support and Progression:

Student Progression:

The college is making efforts to remove the concept of any dropouts. The percent of progression to higher studies is reasonably good, taking into consideration the background of students. In relation to university average the performance of the institution is fairly good. Many Students of this college have secured University ranks upto top twenty levels.

The College has the honour of obtaining more than a dozen Gold Medals on an average in a year obtained from the University of Mysore.

All faculty and students of the college have actively participated in all the State / National / Regional Seminars organised by the college.

Student Support:

There is a visible participation of the students in seminar and paper presentation in some subjects and in the research activities of faculties. The establishment of HRD-I, II and III units were primarily set up to teach Personality Development and communication skills to students. The library has been upgraded by adding a new reference section, setting up digital and virtual section and subscribing to on-line journals. The college campuses are safe and secure for all students.

Student Activities:

In order to improve the personality of students and for improving their overall academic development, the college has taken the following steps:

1. Active participation of students in seminars, paper presentations, live demos etc.
2. Personality Development Programmes
3. Participation in festivals, competitions and quiz programmes
4. Joining Sports, NSS, NCC, YSSC and other forums.

The students are encouraged to participate in many extra-curricular activities.

Facilities for sports and games are very good.

Every year, students are selected to represent the University in the Inter University Tournaments and also to represent the State level teams.

The management is proactive in providing all facilities to outstanding sports persons.

Best Practices in Student Support and Progression:

Management initiatives in promoting talented students in sports and games.

Governance and Leadership:

Institutional Vision and Leadership:

Vision, mission and goals of the institution are in tune with the National Policy on higher education. Institutional leadership is proactive. Management is progressive in its outlook and willing to make reforms and allocate resources wherever needed. Good team spirit among teaching and non-teaching staff is visible.

Organizational Arrangements:

The college has a staff council with the Principal as Chairman and all Heads of the Departments as Members. The Student parliament system is one of the new initiatives started by this college in order to go for participatory management of college activities. The Principal of the college coordinates and monitors the activities of the institution through more than 100 committees. There is decentralization and participative management.

The Grievance redressal mechanism good.

Strategy Development and Deployment:

The college has listed its future plans and are working as a team to achieve the targeted objectives, in association with the stakeholders. At departmental level also, future plans for academic improvements are prepared.

Human Resource Management:

Recruitment policies are in tune with State Government and UGC norms.

Management takes initiatives to fill up the vacancies. Performance appraisal mechanism is in place. College provides adequate welfare schemes to its staff.

The institution has taken several initiatives to enhance the academic competency of the teaching faculty. The following are to mention a few:

To improve the quality of performance of the administrative staff, training in IT related programmes, workshops and Yoga classes were arranged.

Financial Management and resource mobilization:

Budget provisions for academic and administrative activities are adequate. A substantial budgetary provision is made by the management for improving the academic performance of the college. Monitoring of financial management and regularity in external audit are in place.

Best Practices in governance and leadership:

Internal quality assurance system:

The college has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell. The staff meetings are used as a forum for quality improvement and sustenance. The IQAC has already submitted its annual reports to the NAAC. The IQAC prepares the plan of action at the beginning of the academic year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved are analysed at the end of the year, systematically. The college has introduced the mechanism for periodic External Academic Audit for quality improvement.

A fair number of women teachers are recruited to maintain gender equity.

The college has involved students, alumni and parents to coordinate in all its activities for its all round development. Students, parents and alumni perception of the institution is very good. Parents and alumni are working in tandem for the development of the institution. The institution places special attention in promoting civic sense and social responsibility.

GREEN AUDIT

The college is located 12⁰19'16.8" North Latitude and 76⁰37'31.4" East longitude at an elevation of 783 meters MSL at Jayalakshmpuram, Mysore. The campus area is 12889.25 sq.mts with a built space of 6800 sq.mts. The College has a rich diversity of plant species, both potted and large trees. It has about 38 diverse potted plants belonging to important plant families. The college is surrounded by large trees that provide cooling of interiors via shading. While retractable screens have become an effective tool, the advantage to using the shading from internal plants is that when the shading is most required, the inhabitants do not sacrifice to natural settings. The college has achieved this goal through the greening of the campus.

Location 12⁰19'16.80" North, 76⁰37'31.40" East at an elevation of 783 meters



The Post graduate campus is 5 kms away from the main college. It is located 12⁰21'45.68" North latitude and 76⁰37'42.13 East longitude at an elevation of 772 meters. The campus harbours many exotic plants numbering 128. Small scale plantations of Teak and Ashoka trees garland the east region. They have been very useful in high wind breaking and cooling the buildings. A beautiful park in front of the MTA department is an eye-catching site to visitors.

Plants provide a natural solution to cleaner indoor air. When plants transpire water vapour from their leaves, pull air down around their roots. This supplies their root microbes with oxygen. The root microbes also convert other substances in the air, such as toxic chemicals, into a source of food and energy. Microbes, such as bacteria, can rapidly adapt to a chemical contaminant by producing new colonies that are resistant to the chemical. As a result, they become more effective at converting toxic chemicals into food the longer they are exposed to the chemicals. It is also important to remember that the efficiency of plants as a filtering device increases as the concentration of chemicals in the air increases.

Bio mimicry is the science and art of emulating nature’s best biological ideas to solve human problems. Interior plants within a green design are a perfect example. Live indoor plants capes demonstrate nature’s hearty resolve and process of cleaning surrounding air while exchanging it for fresh oxygen. For those who seek clean, natural solutions to environmental issues, live interior landscaping can serve as a living illustration, affirming belief in nature’s intelligence.

Cooling Interiors via Shading Expressed as a decimal between 0 and 1, shading coefficient represents the percentage of solar heat gain that is transmitted through a shading system into a building, compared to that of a single pane of clear 1/8-inch glass. The lower the shading coefficient, the lower the heat gains through the material, and thus the better the solar control performance. While retractable screens have become an effective tool, the advantage to using the shading from internal plants is that when the shading is most required, the inhabitants don’t sacrifice exposure to natural settings (plants). In order to achieve these goals the college has a large number of small and large plants within the campus. The list of a few plants are given below.

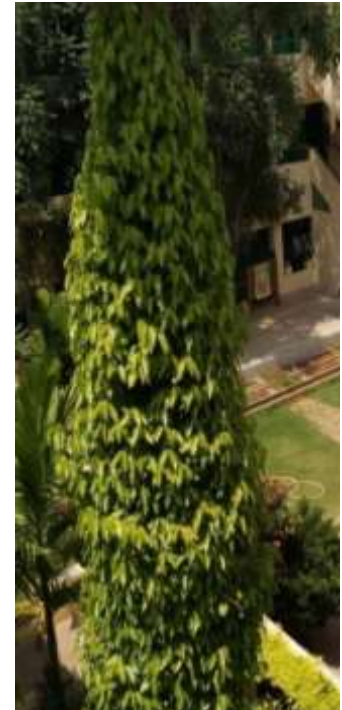

Rainwater Harvesting

Rainwater harvesting is the accumulation and deposition of rainwater for reuse on-site, rather than allowing it to runoff. Uses include water for garden and other domestic purposes with proper treatment. In many places the water collected is just redirected to a deep pit with percolation. Rainwater harvesting provides an independent water supply during regional water restrictions. It provides water when there is a drought, can help mitigate flooding of low-lying areas, and reduces demand on wells which may enable ground water levels to be sustained. Sometimes it also helps in the availability of potable water as rainwater is substantially free of salinity and other salts. The stored rainwater may need to be analyzed properly before use in a way appropriate to ensure its safe use. The Microbiology department of the college provides expertise in examining the microbial contamination of the water. It has often been found that the quality of collected rainwater is generally better than that of [surface water](#). The rainwater harvesting system at the PG campus is depicted below.



Storm water from the campus is checked by the rainwater harvesting unit located in the campus. The harvested water is used for various purposes except for drinking. It also nurses a handy fruit garden at the adjacent side of the tank. The excess outflow from the tank is used for watering the plants. . The quality of water is found to be better than surface water. A part of the out flow of the water drains into a pond which has many hydrophytes like, *Lotus*, *Nymphaea*, *Hydrilla*, *Ceratophyllum* and other smaller hydrophytes. A few of these aspects has not been possible at the UG campus due to lack of space.

Solar Energy

In 2011, the [International Energy Agency](#) said that "the development of affordable, inexhaustible and clean solar energy technologies will have huge longer-term benefits. It will increase countries' energy security through reliance on an indigenous, inexhaustible and mostly import-independent resource, enhance [sustainability](#), reduce pollution, lower the costs of mitigating [climate change](#), and keep [fossil fuel](#) prices lower than otherwise. These advantages are global. Hence the additional costs of the incentives for early deployment should be considered learning investments; they must be wisely spent and need to be widely shared.

Solar photovoltaic's have also been employed at both the campuses. A large solar unit at the MTA charges 8 UPS systems through which a computer laboratory with 40 units is regularly used see pictures below)

Solid waste management

Improperly managed solid waste poses a risk to human health and the environment. Uncontrolled dumping and improper waste handling causes a variety of problems, including contaminating water, attracting insects and rodents, and increasing flooding due to blocked canals or gullies. Improper waste management also increases greenhouse gas emissions, which contribute to climate change from solid waste. Planning for and implementing a comprehensive program for waste collection, transport, and disposal along with activities to prevent or recycle vast can eliminate these problems.

The major solid waste management activities are waste prevention, recycling and composting, and combustion and disposal in properly designed, constructed, and managed landfills. Each of these activities requires careful planning, financing, collection, and transport, all of which are discussed and an integrated solid waste management system has been established. This unit takes care of the Grass, leaves, and other wastes from lawns and backyard that gardens accounts for an estimated 18% campus waste. Leaf waste can account for as much as 60-80% in the fall. Strategies for the method of composting are in progress.

General considerations on green auditing.


A multi-utility roof garden is being set up for student recreation, canteen facilities and minor student related activities. The work is in progress.

Each of the activities mentioned above requires careful planning which is discussed by the college committee. The college has a unique program called as ASIC. Under this various activities have been grouped and each teacher is allotted with one responsibility. Two or three students are tagged to the teacher who discusses cleanness and maintaining activities in the college. The committee discuss and maintains power saving strategies, conservation of water, display and location of boards and maintaining cleanness in class rooms. All Heads of the Departments are provided with e-mails through which sharing of circulars is done thus reducing the use of print. Offices can be one of the biggest offenders when it comes to unnecessary paper waste. Whenever possible, business documents are kept virtual rather than printing them out. Not only does it minimize paper waste, it's easier to reorganize and share virtual data. Two-sided, instead of one sided is printed and unnecessary cover sheets on faxes are nixed. Large envelopes for interoffice mail and paper that's already been used for scratch paper are reused. Library paper waste and other printing paper is disposed for recycling. Book shelves are regularly cleaned and used of fungicides and pesticides are avoided. Air conditioners are used only when necessary. E-waste generated is not much. However old computer sets are sold at nominal prices to the needy college staff

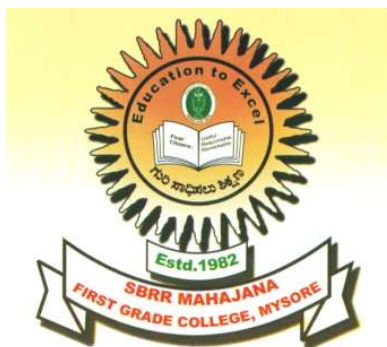

Report of the Gender Audit of SBRR Mahajana First Grade College, Pooja Bhagavat Memorial Mahajana Post Graduate Centre and Mahajana Tourism Development Institute

Preamble

Gender Audit of educational institutions is a process for organizational assessment and a tool for action planning from a gender perspective. It critically examines the capacity of institutions to ensure a 'safe and secure' ambience for women and girl students, faculty and administrative staff. The participatory audit process helps to identify institutional strengths and challenges to integrating gender in the institution's systems and operations and in programmes and activities.

Gender audit encourages the stakeholders in an education system to engage in a dialogue and reflect about the strengths and gaps of the system vis-à-vis gender related issues. According to an ILO Manifesto gender auditing helps institutions to focus on such areas as:

- Mainstreaming gender as a cross-cutting concern within the unit's objectives, programme and budget.
- Existing gender expertise and competence.
- Information and knowledge management on gender issues.
- Systems and instruments in use for accountability, evaluating and monitoring on gender equality.
- Choice of partner organizations.
- Advocacy products and public image.
- Staffing and human resources concerning balance between women and men, as well as gender-friendly policies.
- Organizational culture and its effects on gender equality.

Three institutions of higher education functioning under the aegis of the Mahajana Education Society decided to go for a gender audit and hence this study, which was carried out by applying the participatory methodology. In each of the three institutions I had meetings with representatives of students, faculty and administrative staff, besides visiting the college campuses and women's hostels.

Given below is a brief profile of each of the three institutions.

SBRR Mahajana First Grade College

The College which was started in the year 1982 as a women's college became a co-educational institution in the year 1989. It offers B.A., BBM, BCA, B.Com and B.Sc. courses and currently has on its rolls 2034 students, out of whom 578 are women (28.42%). The College has on its faculty 59 men and 48 women. Among the administrative staff 38 are men and 29 women.

Pooja Bhagavat Memorial Mahajana Post Graduate Centre

This Centre which was established in the year 1999 offers Post Graduate programmes in Chemistry, Computer Science, Commerce, Economics, Life Science, Social Work and two MBA courses. The Centre has a total student strength of 655 out of whom 244 (37.25%) are women. The Centre has on its faculty 22 men and 20 women. Among the administrative staff 27 are men and 22 women.

Mahajana Tourism Development Institute

The Institute established in the year 2007 offers Masters Courses in Tourism Administration, Tourism and Air Travel Management, a Bachelor's Course in Tourism and Hospitality and a Diploma Programme in Hotel Management. It has a total student strength of 355 out of whom 58 (16.34%) are women. The Institute has on its faculty 6 men and 4 women. Among the administrative staff 10 are men and 5 women.

Main Issues addressed in the Report

The main areas that were covered during my interaction are listed below:

- Knowledge of the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 and legal rights of women.
- Physical facilities in the college campus and hostel.
- Security issues in the college campus and hostel.
- Awareness programmes aimed at gender sensitization and women's empowerment.
- Experiences of gender related abuse/embarrassment/harassment.

In analysing campus life from a gender perspective, the participants in the interaction were asked to identify both the strengths and gaps from the point of view of women. They were also asked to come out with suggestions for engendering the campus.

In the section that follows the outcomes of my interaction are presented. Since most of the issues addressed are common to all the three institutions, both the strengths and gaps that are outlined apply to all the three institutions. Wherever there is an issue that is specifically applicable to an institution, it has been addressed separately.

Strengths

- There is by and large no feeling of gender discrimination in the three campuses. Both policies and practices support the culture of gender inclusive governance, and in this sense there is a positive ambience for further strengthening the gender component in the administration and day-to-day life of the campuses.
- Selection of faculty, students and administrative staff is free from gender biases and there is clear indication of equal access to opportunities.
- The setting up of SPARSH (Sensitization to, Prevention of, and Redressal for Sexual Harassment) Committee in the institution is a positive step in the direction of addressing gender related concerns. The Women's Empowerment Committee is also making efforts to create awareness about gender related matters. In the event of an issue that requires immediate attention, this Committee takes up the matter and works out a solution. The Human Rights Forum has also collaborated with the Women's Empowerment Committee in organising gender related programmes.
- The Health and Hygiene Committee has been providing support for women students who are in need of medical attention on a case-to-case basis. The institution has a functioning network with select hospitals and in the event of a medical emergency; students are given appropriate treatment under intimation to parents.
- The Department of Psychology brings out a Wallpaper **PEP** that often addresses gender related themes. The Staff Co-ordinator presents the highlights of each edition in the College Assembly before it is released for public viewing.
- The Department of Psychology offers counseling services to women students going through stress or facing problems in their personal or student lives. The Department also offers a space for them to share their concerns with the faculty.
- Individual departments have organised seminars/workshops with a focus on gender issues. Some students have also participated in events organised by other institutions in awareness building programmes.
- There are separate toilets for women in different locations in all the three institutions. In the event of need, women staff members allow students to use staff toilets.
- There is round the clock security in the college campus and hostels. In-house security staff guard the premises.
- As per the data provided by the college offices, only 2 cases of sexual harassment have been reported in the last five years. Action has been initiated against those involved.

Gaps

- The activities of the Women's Empowerment Committee are largely limited to SBRR Mahajana First Grade College and the involvement of students and faculty of Pooja Bhagavat Memorial Mahajana Post Graduate Centre and Mahajana Tourism Development Institute in the programmes of this committee or with SPARSH is very limited.
- Knowledge levels of the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 or other legal rights of women among women students are very low. Only a few students in all the three institutions are aware of the Act or their legal rights.
- Some toilets have no locks from within, continuous water supply or waste disposal bins.

- In using the toilets located near classrooms or laboratories, women students experience a sense of embarrassment because male students are moving around.
- Copies of the provisions of the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 are not yet displayed in key locations in the college campuses.

Suggestions

- The provisions of the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 be displayed in a prominent place in each of the three institutions.
- Telephone numbers of Conveners of the Women's Empowerment Committee, SPARSH, local police station, representatives of women's organization can be displayed at a designated space.
- Student Committees with women representatives of different courses in all the three institutions could be set up to act as a bridge between the management and faculty **and** students. This Committee could liaison with the Disciplinary Committee for grievance redressal, if any and discussion of other relevant issues.
- In both the women's hostels student committees could be set up .This action would open up a platform for dialogue on issues pertaining to food, tensions between students of different states and up gradation of facilities.
- Awareness building programmes focusing attention on the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, legal rights of women and state and civil society initiatives for women's empowerment be organised periodically. As of now in most cases the tendency is to react or respond when an untoward incident occurs, but one does not have to wait for such incidents to happen. By educating women about the many new laws upholding the rights of women that have come into existence, not only are they empowered, but also it is possible for

them to spread the light of gender sensitive knowledge in their families, class rooms and neighbourhood.

- It is advisable to involve male students whenever gender sensitization programmes are organised as this is basic to the creation of a gender sensitive society.
- A Committee involving faculty from all the three institutions could be set up to plan and organize these gender awareness programmes. During my interaction with the students many students expressed their desire to be acquainted with such programmes.
- Steps must be taken to ban pornographic material from mobile phones in the college campus (this suggestion came from the students).
- Installing locks from within, lights and placing waste disposal bins in all the toilets could be done after taking stock of the situation in all the toilets in the institutions. Cleanliness related responsibilities could be assigned to an Estate Committee that has student representatives. This not only gives a sense of responsibility but also makes them accountable for maintenance of infrastructure. It is also advisable to consider relocation of those toilets situated near class rooms, drinking water facilities and labs to ensure a sense of privacy to women students.
- CC TVs could be installed in parking lots and laboratories.
- A Woman's Retiring room be provided both for students and staff in all the three institutions. These rooms could serve as a resting place in times of physical discomforts that they may experience during certain periods of their life. It is also advised to equip these rooms with emergency medical kits, sanitary napkins and such other material that women may require in emergency situations.
- A playground for women in the MTDI would enable them to relax in privacy.
- Self-defense classes could be organised for all women students.
- A short term course on gender issues may be offered to students (men & women).

Given the commitment of Mahajana Education Society to issues of gender equality and maintaining a gender balance in the institutional ambience, it is hoped that the stage that has already been set for mainstreaming gender into campus life would be further strengthened in future.
